18	WHEREAS, a multimodal transportation system, where streets are designed and operated to assure mobility, safety, and accessibility for all users, is integral to the
20	success of Orange County's growth management strategy; and
22	WHEREAS, Orange County has adopted Comprehensive Plan goals, objectives, and policies that support safe, convenient, and efficient pedestrian mobility; and
24 26	WHEREAS, Orange County has an established capital improvement program that includes annual funding for sidewalk construction and pedestrian safety improvements; and
28	WHEREAS, pedestrian injuries and fatalities are tragic, and there is a desire to improve safety for both residents and visitors; and

32	WHEREAS, Section 316.130, Florida Statutes, states that vehicle drivers must yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing within a crosswalk; and a pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than a crosswalk must yield the right-of-way to a
34	vehicle; and
36	WHEREAS, a systematic regimen of public education, low-cost engineering, and high-visibility enforcement has been demonstrated to reduce pedestrian injuries and
38	fatalities in other markets; and
40	WHEREAS, such programs have been shown to produce sustainable results by reducing deaths and injuries related to driving under the influence (DUI) and failing to
42	wear a seatbelt.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

46	Section 1. Orange County's Support for "Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian
	Safety." Orange County supports the principles and practices of "Best Foot Forward for
48	Pedestrian Safety," and joins with other cities, towns, counties, law enforcement, and
	regional planning agencies in a regional effort to reduce pedestrian injuries and fatalities.
50	Accordingly, Orange County intends to participate in this effort by educating both drivers
	and pedestrians through established means of constituent communications and by
52	enhancing crosswalk signage to support high-visibility pedestrian enforcement actions.
	These actions will enhance the health and well-being of the residents and visitors of
54	Orange County and contribute to Orange County's goal of creating a more walkable and
	livable community.
