#### Operation Best Foot Forward: Crosswalk Crackdown as 340,000 Students Head **Back to School in Orange, Osceola and Seminole Counties**

ORLANDO, Fla. (July 23, 2021) More than 340,000 students across Central Florida are heading back to the classroom and roads are expected to get much busier. As part of its ongoing efforts to improve pedestrian safety, deputies with the Orange County and Seminole County Sheriff's Offices will join officers from the City of Orlando, Apopka, Kissimmee, St. Cloud, Casselberry and the Town of Oakland for Operation Best Foot Forward to focus on drivers who fail to stop for pedestrians crossing the street at crosswalks.

The Best Foot Forward crosswalk enforcement operation will take place on Tuesday, July 27 and Wednesday, July 28 from 7:15 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at 15 heavily traveled crosswalk locations within close proximity to schools. Officers dressed in plain clothes will cross the street while uniformed officers monitor the crosswalk for drivers who do not stop for pedestrians or who take unsafe and illegal actions. Drivers failing to comply during Operation Best Foot Forward will be issued warnings or citations, which is a \$164 minimum fine and three points on a driver's license as Florida law requires.

High-visibility crosswalk enforcement actions are an effective way to communicate pedestrian traffic laws to both drivers and pedestrians. The Best Foot Forward for pedestrian safety program conducts these operations approximately four times a year. Since 2012, Orange, Osceola and Seminole law enforcement has conducted more than 180 crosswalk enforcement operations as part of the Best Foot Forward program to improve street safety.

#### Notable highlights of crosswalk locations to be enforced by local law enforcement starting Tuesday:

- Millenia Blvd. & Timarron Dr. is a crosswalk in Orlando directly in front of Millenia Gardens Elementary School where only one out of every 10 drivers are stopping for pedestrians trying to cross the street. Officers will enforce this location on Tuesday, starting at 8:30 a.m.
- Pine Hills Rd. & El Trio Way is a mid-block crosswalk in Orange County where a resident was hit and killed earlier this year. Only half of drivers stop for pedestrians in this crosswalk within walking distance of Evans High School. Deputies will enforce this location on Wednesday, starting at 9:30 a.m.
- 17th St. & Michigan Avenue. in St. Cloud is between St. Cloud High and Middle Schools where the city installed a sidewalk after a student petitioned for safety improvements. Officers will enforce this location Wednesday morning, starting at 7:15 a.m.

Snow Hill Rd. & Jacobs Trail in Seminole County is where only 10% of drivers yield to pedestrians
in this crosswalk by Walker Elementary School and the Flagler Trailhead. Deputies will enforce
this location on Wednesday, starting at 8:00 a.m.

Although this effort is primarily focused on drivers, safety is a two-way street. Pedestrians, especially children walking to and from school, should follow the rules of the road – walk on the sidewalks, never run, look both ways before crossing the street, and be aware of their surroundings.

#### **About Best Foot Forward for Pedestrian Safety Program**

The Best Foot Forward for pedestrian safety program is administered by the local non-profit Bike/Walk Central Florida and first launched by MetroPlan Orlando, Orange County and the City of Orlando in 2012. It expanded to Osceola County, Kissimmee and St. Cloud in 2017 and Seminole County and Casselberry in October 2019. The cities of Apopka and Oakland most recently joined the coalition.

Best Foot Forward was created to reverse the conflict between pedestrians and drivers by focusing on one specific behavior change - getting more drivers to yield to pedestrians at marked crosswalks as <a href="Florida law">Florida law</a> requires. More than a campaign, Best Foot Forward is a behavior change-based program designed to improve road safety through consistent and persistent education, high-visibility crosswalk enforcement and low-cost engineering at marked crosswalks near elementary schools and LYNX bus stops, in urban areas and cross-sections of low and high-speed roads.

Studies show that crosswalk enforcement is critical in boosting the number of drivers who yield to pedestrians because vehicle-versus-pedestrian culture flourishes when unchecked. To effect long-term change, enforcement is combined with engineering improvements as well as educating residents and visitors.

#### **Best Foot Forward program progress: 2012- June 2021**

- Operating in three counties, Orange, Osceola and Seminole Counties
- 186 crosswalks enforced by law enforcement
- More than 10,300 citations and warnings issued since 2012 for failure to yield to a pedestrian
- 44% increase average yielding behavior change at those crosswalks being tracked by Best Foot Forward

Covering Orange, Osceola and now Seminole Counties, Best Foot Forward is the largest grassroots coalition focused on pedestrian safety in the nation. Since 2012, when Best Foot Forward was launched, the percentage of drivers yielding to people in marked crosswalks has increased from 17% to more than 60% on roads with a speed limit of 35 mph and lower and 2% to 43% on roads 40 mph and higher.

#### About Bike/Walk Central Florida, Administers the Best Foot Forward Program

Bike/Walk Central Florida (BWCF) is a 501(c)(3) that promotes walkable and bikeable communities through raising public awareness and advocating for safe, active transportation and recreation. BWCF manages the <a href="Best Foot Forward">Best Foot Forward</a> for pedestrian safety program for its partners in Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties. Best Foot Forward is a behavior change-based program designed to improve road safety through consistent and persistent education, high-visibility enforcement and

low-cost engineering at marked crosswalks. Best Foot Forward was launched in Orange County in June 2012. It more recently expanded into Osceola County in 2017 and Seminole County in 2019. Best Foot Forward is one of the largest grassroots programs of its kind in the nation.

BWCF coordinates the Bike5Cities program and its annual bike ride to promote safe bicycling routes and enhanced multi-use trails throughout Central Florida. The organization supports building, expanding and linking regional trails and completing the Coast-to-Coast Connector trail. BWCF encourages transportation corridor planning and design by using Complete Streets principles for the benefit of all transportation users.

Officers from the Orlando, Apopka, Kissimmee, St. Cloud, Casselberry, and Oakland Police Departments, teamed up with the Orange and Seminole County deputies on July 27 and 28 to enforce 14 crosswalks. With hundreds of thousands of local students heading back to school, law enforcement specifically targeted drivers at busy locations near area schools.

Local media outlets ran a total of 116 stories on the enforcement. These mentions are worth an estimated total of \$418,000, the equivalent cost of buying advertisements to run at the same time/place. 



Crosswalk crackdown targets drivers at intersections near Orange, Seminole schools

CASSELBERRY, Fla. - As many Central Florida students get ready to head back to school in two weeks, local law enforcement are cracking down on drivers not stopping for pedestrians crossing the streets

Tuesday and Wednesday, police in plain clothes will cross the street while uniformed officers monitor the crosswalk for drivers who do not stop for pedestrians at 15 heavily traveled crosswalks near schools in Orange and Seminole counties.



# Police take part in pedestrian/auto education

In an effort to educate drivers about keeping pedestrians safe, Apopka police officers spent three hours Wednesday, July 28, crossing Fifth Street in downtown Apopka, walking back and forth at a midblock crosswalk between Park Avenue and Central Avenue

There is a new crosswalk with a flashing beacon from the new-ly refurbished municipal parking lot on the north side of Fifth Street to the south side of the street so that people attending events at the Apopka Community Center/VFW can cross the street safely.

It's not the first time that offi-cers from the Apopka Police De-partment have done sigh a detail, but it is the first time that the de-

forts with Bike/Walk Central Florida and the organization's Operation Best Foot Forward.

Several other law enforcement agencies were also conducting efforts to educate drivers that they need to stop when a pedestrian is trying to cross the road.

The idea, organizers said, was education not writing tickets. However, the Apopka officers did write 10 citations and warnings, while the eight Central Florida agencies involved wrote a total of 301 citations and warnings. Orlando Police Department wrote the most, 99.

"This program is a great way of not only educating the drivers, but educating the pedestrians be-cause it takes both to have a problem said Mayor Bryan Nelson, who was there for part of the time

that when they get there and there's somebody in the crosswalk, they (pedestrian) have the right-of-way."

The program, which operates in Orange, Seminole, and Osceola counties, was held about two weeks prior to school starting as the counties combine for more than 340,000 students with about two-thirds of those students located in Orange County.

The mayor said having more crosswalks on some roads is a necessity, but that it has to be balanced.

"You've got to make it more accessible to pedestrians. If they've got to go six blocks to get to a crosswalk, there are some advantages to adding some additional ones. But, the more you put in, the slower the normal traffic goes. You've got to look at what's the best compromise for getting safe pedestrian traffic as well as getting folks through town," Nelson said.

Emily Hanna, the executive director of non-profit Bike/Walk Central Florida, was in Apopka early during the special detail.

"We are out here with Best Foot Forward to educate drivers on the new, flashing beacon installed on Fifth Street in the city of Apopka,"

"We think it's important because we believe Fifth Street is a cutthrough road and we've seen some speeding occur and it's really important that we educate drivers that they need to slow down, especially where there's pedestrian activity.

According to Bike/Walk Central Florida, Best Foot Forward is the largest grassroots coalition focused on pedestrian safety in the nation.

Since 2012, when Best Foot Forward was launched in Orange County the percentage of drivers yielding to people in marked crosswalks has in creased from 17 percent to more than 60 percent on roads with a speed limit of 35 mph and lower and 2 percent to 43 percent on roads 40 mph and high

#### Officers Across Osceola County Cracking Down at Crosswalks

Officers with the Kissimmee and St. Cloud Police Departments joined forces with law enforcement across Orange and Seminole Counties as part of Operation Best Foot Forward, to crack down on drivers who fall to yield and stop for pedestrians in crosswalks, specifically near load schools. We know tocal roads will become busier when hundreds of thousands of students return to Central Florida classroomist starting the week of August 2. That's why officers and deputs plan to educated drivers who fall to stop and remain stopped for pedestrians in marked crosswalks as Florida law requires.

Over the two-day operation Tuesday, July 27 and Wednesday, July 28, Law enforcement in Orange County, Seminole County, Orlando, Apopha, Casselberry, Kissimmer, St. Cloud and Oakland issued 301 citations and warnings to drivers who failed to stop and remain stopped for pedestrians in marked crosswalks, as Florida law requires.

Officers saw too many close calls Tuesday and Wednesday, with drivers coming dangerously close to hitting officers and volunteers at several marked crosswalk locations. The majority of drivers who were pulled over told officers and deputies that they had no idea they were breaking the law. It is particularly concerning given that each of these crosswalks is near a local school.

#### OCSO and KPD keep students safe with Operation BFF

Osceola County, FL - The Kissimmee Police Department (KPD) and the Osceola County Sheriff's Office (OCSO) are making sure kids stay safe as they head back to school. That's why on August 15, officers from KPD and OCSO will be conducting their second highvisibility crosswalk enforcement action, dubbed Operation BFF, across Osceola County, At their first Operation, more than 95 drivers received a citation or warning for failure to stop for a pedestrian in a marked crosswalk. On the flip side, several drivers did comply with the law. One driver even called out that he had heard about the operation on the news and knew that if he didn't stop, he was going to get a ticket. That's where enforcement and education intertwine – through the media coverage before and after Operation BFF. OCSO and KPD will be conducting Operation BFF on Wednesday, August 15, beginning at 7:30AM. Back in April, KPD and OCSO enforced the driver yield law at three marked crosswalks near local schools. Enforced crosswalks include: Donegan Ave & Coral Ave. -Speed limit: 35mph - OCSO; Thacker Ave & Kissimmee Trail (2310 N. Thacker Ave.) -Speed limit: 40mph - KPD and Hoagland Blvd. & Hideaway Bay - Speed limit: 30mph -KPD. Officers dressed in plain clothes crossed the street in these crosswalks, giving drivers enough time to yield to them. Those who didn't - a total of 96 - were pulled over and given a warning or a citation. Officers also took the time to educate drivers on the driver yield law and their responsibility in keeping people walking safe. Thank you, KPD and OSCO, for all your hard work. Both education and enforcement are part of the "Triple E" method of combining high-visibility Enforcement, Education and low-cost Engineering at marked crosswalks where drivers fail to yield to people walking. The Best Foot Forward coalition, which helps coordinate Operation BFF, has been implementing this method in Orange County since 2012 with positive results. Local officials came out to support the cause and see first-hand what enforcement was all about with OCSO and KPD's first enforcement action. A huge thank you to Osceola County Commissioner Cheryl Grieb. Kissimmee Mayor Jose Alvarez, Kissimmee Commissioner Olga Gonzalez and Kissimmee Commissioner Jim Fisher for putting your best foot forward and showing your support.

# St. Cloud Police issue 35 tickets and warnings during Operation Best Foot Forward

Parents and students know it, but maybe all Osceola County motorists don't: school will be back in session next week.

With that comes a lot more students and other pedestrians on sidewalks, crossing streets.

Local law enforcement joined forces last week to make sure drivers yield the right away and stop for pedestrians in crosswalks, specifically near schools, as part of the annual Operation Best Foot Forward. In some cases drivers were hit right in the wallet: Kissimmee and St. Cloud police issued \$164 tickets to some drivers who didn't properly yield to pedestrians in marked crosswalks as Florida law requires.

This operation reinforces that drivers really need to look out for kids - a reminder that hit home in July when a 10-year old was struck and killed trying to cross U.S. Highway 192.

During the operation, officers in plain clothes cross the street while uniformed officers monitor the crosswalk for drivers who do not stop for pedestrians.





#### **Twitter Audience by Gender**













Day Two of #OperationBFF crosswalk enforcement starts in one hour. The Orange County Sheriff's Office, Florida, Apopka Police Department, Seminole County Sheriff's Office, Casselberry Police Department, Kissimmee Police Department and St. Cloud Police Department - Florida will be stationed at local crosswalks enforcing Florida's driver yield law. The law states that drivers must yield slow down or stop - for a pedestrian crossing the street in a crosswalk, even when traffic controls are not present. Drivers who fail to do this can expect a minimum \$164 ticket and three points on their drivers license.

As Central Floridians gear up for back-to-school, a crosswalk enforcement is essential to prepare drivers for an increase of students walking and biking to class, especially in the morning hours. 






# Orange County Commissioner Christine Moore Facebook Live Coverage

On July 27, the police presence at Millenia Blvd. & Timarron Dr. in the City of Orlando was highlighted on the Waze traffic app. This happened because multiple app users submitted a tip that officers were patrolling the area, which created an alert for other drivers to slow down and be aware. Though Waze is not a traditional social media platform, it is a digital application aimed at connecting people as they travel. And in the case of Best Foot Forward, it increased visibility of a marked crosswalk.
